### Command Teen Council Mission

The mission of the Command Teen Council is to empower Army Reserve teens, ages 13-17, through increased and improved communication between them and their Command's leadership; to ultimately enact change, which will improve quality of life for Army Reserve Youth; and to create an environment which promotes growth through structured curriculum. Command Teen Council members are emerging youth leaders, actively participating in civic and community engagements, and planning and implementing Command-wide teen programming.



### What do Command Teen Council members do?

Command Teen Council Members are educators, representatives, and the voice of Army Reserve Youth. They provide valuable, accurate information and support to their peers, Family Members, members of the community and the Command they represent.

### Among other things, Command Teen Council Members...

- ◆ Create awareness for the Military Children and Youth "who serve too."
- ◆ Participate in monthly conference calls with other Command Teen Council members
- ◆ Meet several times a year, depending on availability of funds
- ◆ Have an opportunity to become a member of the Army Reserve Teen Panel
- ◆ Is an active volunteer in their sponsoring Unit as well as their community

- ◆ To help increase communication between Youth and your Command
- ◆ To provide valuable insights regarding what Military Children and Youth need and want regardless of phase of the deployment cycle
